## **Contest Objectives:**

- To engage the local population, students and adults alike, in writing and in the creative arts
- To create a special (online-only) event that is accessible to all local residents, regardless of health barriers and regardless of the varying COVID-related restrictions on events.
- To encourage local residents to think about the goals and topics that are the driving principles of our market, such as: sustainability, farming & growing food, arts & culture, skill-building (learning to paint, shape clay into pottery, learning to cook, etc.), etc.
- To promote local literacy.
- To promote local aspiring writers; to convert aspiring writers to 'published writers'.
- To inspire and engage youth.

## Format: Non-Fiction (Personal Experience Short Story Writing)

**Topics:** Must reflect the endeavours of the Cedar Farmers Market.

Contest Open: October 7th, 2021

Contest Closed: November 30th, 2021 11:59 PM PST

### **Rules Overview**

Submissions must be 1,000 - 2000 words.

Submissions must be in English.

Submissions must be original non-fiction, written by the submitter.

Submissions must not be previously published short stories.

# **Rights**

Participants retain rights to their submissions.

Participants grant us (Cedar Farmers Market) allowance to share their short stories online, both on our website and on our various social media platforms.

**Participation is open to** all residents of Ladysmith, the City of Nanaimo, and the Greater Regional District of Nanaimo.

Submissions per person per year: 1

### Other Restrictions:

Cedar Farmers Market 2021 Vendors, staff, guest judges, and volunteers; and their employees, household members, and immediate family members are not eligible to participate.

## **Prize Awards:**

**Grand Prize: \$400** 

1st Runner-Up: \$200

2nd Runner-Up: \$150

Best U-19: \$100

Note: Grand Prize is open to all ages. In theory, a student/youth would be eligible for both the U-19 prize as well as one of three top prizes.
